Dear Families and Carers

Welcome back to school and I hope you enjoyed the family time together. I look forward to hearing about all of the children's 'adventures' and hope the GB Olympic team has given them inspiration and a vision for what can be achieved with a positive mind-set!

It's always an exciting time of year with the children coming back to start in their new classes, some with new teachers and as always, they looked really smart in their new uniforms on the first day back. Thank you, I always say that it shows a pride for themselves and the school and puts the children in the right frame of mind for learning.

Our year 6 children made great achievements last year before seeing them off to High School. As you will know from the press and previous newsletters, national expectations for children's learning increased significantly last year and they all rose to the challenge, working incredibly hard. As well as Spanish, PE and Music, a main focus in school will be Reading this year. As always, we express how important reading daily at home is to the children's learning. Home-School Reading Diaries will continue and other reading initiatives are being organised, including raising the profile of the Reading Raffle and welcoming 'Dogs for Kids' into school. As discussed in previous newsletters, this year KS2 will be attending lessons at Tiverton Swimming Baths and during the holidays, I am sure you will be pleased to know that the swimming pool liner has been replaced and a patio area and replacement lights and the pool is ready to use and has been today!

The Curriculum theme this term is 'The Romans'. Teachers will be sending out information about the children's learning for the term in the next day or so; please look on the website under 'Class Pages' for further information and for 'Meet the Parents' sessions. We start off with a Key Stage Two visit to Bath and a Roman Experience Day for Key Stage One, both of which the children will be really excited about and will provide a great stimulus and platform for their learning during the term, no doubt filling them with inspiration!
