

| Go on a number hunt around your house. Tell someone what numbers you have found. What's the highest number you can find? | Write or tell someone your number bonds to 10. Time yourself. Can you beat your fastest time? | Make your own maths snap cards. Make a set of number cards from 0 to 10 or 0 to 20 and make another of drawings that show these numbers like the ones below.  | Can you help the woodland areas and its creatures? On a visit to a woodland, collect rubbish you find. Count how many pieces of rubbish you find. Bring in a photo to show the class.  | Harvest is celebrated during the autumn and thanks is given for crops, including fruit and vegetables. Create a tally chart of the vegetables that your family like and use the most popular ones to make some soup. | Ask someone at home about the toys that they played with when they were a child. Write down some facts about the toy. | Create your own dotto pointillism picture at home in the style that you have done in school. | Create a theme tune for Traction Man using objects from around the house as instruments. | Have a go at inventing and making your own toy. Write step by step instructions so that someone else could make it too. | Puppets have been a popular toy for centuries and are still popular today. Have a go at making your own marionette puppet. http://www.pbs.org/parents/crafts-for-kids/puppy-puppet-marionette/ | Carry out some research about the history of toys and create your own toy timeline with information and pictures. | |
| Go on a material hunt around your house and write a list of the different types of materials that you find. What different materials can you find? What words could you use to describe them? | Collect some autumn leaves and use them to create a collage. | Look at the trees and plants outside. Observe how they change as the seasons change and take photos to show us.  | Ask someone at home for some different materials that you could test. Decide which would be the best to make a parachute for Traction Man. Perhaps you could test them using one of your own toys. Record how quickly the toy drops with each different material in a table. | With adult help make your own super healthy salad fit for a super hero. Don't forget to write a list of the ingredients you will need. Take a photo to show us before you eat your delicious creation! | Make your own bird feed.
