(board game, card game, memory game, observation game etc.)</p>	<p>Research and draw a World War 2 leader, apart from Hitler and include 6 facts about them.</p>
<p>Draw and explain what things you would want to take with you if you were evacuated.</p>	<p>Visit your local library and find information books on the Second World War. Write a list of the books you found.</p>	<p>Find out about one of the countries involved in World War 2.
