Our Character Education Focus Virtues this term

Academic

Fieldmice Class. Our focus story for the next two weeks is Superworm by Julia Donaldson. As a group we have found and started our own wormery and we find it exciting to check their growing burrows each morning! We have also been using the book to learn about rhyming and describing words. Additionally, we have been using the book as inspiration to use magnifying glasses and discover worms and bugs in their natural habitat.

Hedgehog Class have been thoroughly brilliant over the last couple of weeks. They have enjoyed learning What the Ladybird Heard and the superpowers that SuperWorm has, and linking that to finding out all about mini-beasts and the natural world. In maths, they have been practising their number sequencing up to 20 as well as their number formation.

Squirrel Class. In maths this week Year 2 have been practising our 5 times tables, arithmetic and reasoning skills as we get closer to SATS. Year 1 have been measuring using objects such as counting cubes and then rulers to record the length of familiar resources in cms. In literacy we have been learning about acrostic poems and have started to draft our own versions ready for the Easter service next week.

Fox Class have been amazing again this week. They have written super character descriptions from our film unit, 'The DreamGiver', where they included expanded noun phrases, adjectives, similes and prepositions. In Maths, the new topic is Fractions and Fox class have had a practical start to the unit using Cuisenaire rods, Bar models and Part-Whole models.

Stag class have been studying the story 'Clockwork' by Philip Pullman. They have enjoyed identifying the features of a Gothic Fantasy and can't wait to write their own version! Stag class have also enjoyed learning about the Solar System and sharing that with the rest of the school.

Squirrel Class. Some of Squirrel class were lucky to have the chance to compete in a multiskills event at Tiverton High School earlier in the week. They were praised for their excellent behaviour and for being a credit to the school, well done.

Fox Class have welcomed our new year 3 children. It has been great to see everyone getting to know each other and supporting one another both inside and outside of the classroom. Well done to everyone for showing kindness and generosity.

Stag Class Year 5/6 footballers played a match against Bolham. The boys and girls showed many character virtues in what was a close match. Stag class members also welcomed members of the community to lunch this week, serving our guests with maturity and friendliness.

Character Education

Squirrel class have shown fantastic resilience and have coped really well with the class changes. Year 2 have modelled classroom expectations beautifully and shared skills such as learning to play the glockenspiel in music.

Fox Class have shown respect for our environment and the mini-beasts that live within the school grounds. Our Science topic on Living things and their habitats, has shown how we are all connected. On our mini-beast hunt, we found a variety of different creatures and everyone studied them with great care.

Stag Class have been looking at where the food we eat comes from and the impact on the environment. We have been using <u>critical thinking</u> skills to find a way of making our food more sustainable.

Squirrel class have been using Ed Shed to support their spelling and maths learning this week.

Fox Class have had a fantastic experience with the Sciencedipity workshop. They created 'George's Marvellous Medicine', great slime and a super reaction with Mentos and Diet Coke. Everyone was very engaged!

Stag Class have been using their Chromebooks to explore ways of presenting their learning. They have particularly impressive in maths, using tables and graphs to represent their findings to an area and volume investigation.
