

# **C360** Cornerstones Curriculum

# **Academic Community Character Innovation**

# These are the four cornerstones of our curriculum. Each week the children practise virtues that underpin these cornerstones.

**Fieldmice Class.** We have all enjoyed playing outside this past week and exploring our topic of "Under the Sea" using the water trays and appropriately designed tuff trays. As you are all aware, the weather is extremely hot, so we have taken this opportunity to discuss sun safety with the children - wearing a hat, having sunscreen on and drinking lots of water. Please ensure that your child arrives in school with sunscreen on, a hat and a water bottle - we remind them throughout the day to have a big drink!

For the next two weeks, our focus book is "Sharing a Shell" by Julia Donaldson. This book continues our topic learning, whilst also focusing on sharing and respect - the virtue that the whole school is expanding upon at the moment.

**Hedgehog Class** have demonstrated the Character virtues of curiosity and creativity which link with the Academic and Character cornerstones. The children have been really enjoying our new curriculum topic, 'On the beach'. They have been learning about different sea creatures and writing fact files. They have also used pastels to create some amazing pictures of puffins, linking to our new story 'Puffin Peter'. In maths we have been recapping numbers to 20 and adding more.



**Squirrel Class** have demonstrated the Character virtues of resilience in the writing this week as we have written up stories for our portfolios based on the film Little Boat. We have also been writing persuasive letters based on the focus text The Day the Crayons Quit. In Maths we have learning about time using analogue clocks. In our topic work we have focussed on tourism, what it is to be a tourist and what we would to do as tourists in a coastal town.

**Fox Class** have demonstrated the Character virtues of courage and curiosity, which links with the Academic and Character cornerstones. They have achieved this by working incredibly hard to complete their NFER assessment tests to the very best of their ability. Year 4 have also completed their Government Multiplication times table check, which allows them only 6 second to answer the question. They all were brilliant! As a class, we have started to plan our non-chronological reports about animals in the Amazon Rainforest (which links to our Geography topic). I cannot wait for the class to present these in Celebration assembly!


