I would also like to thank all members of staff who work tirelessly to ensure that the children at Bampton Primary get the best possible education and opportunity that we can give. ### **Academic Community Character Innovation**

# These are the four cornerstones of our curriculum. Each week the children practise virtues that underpin these cornerstones.

**Fieldmice Class** have thoroughly enjoyed our "Under the Sea" topic this half term and we have worked together to complete a fantastic display board that showcases the children's creativity, determination and curious nature. The book Hooray for Fish, by Lucy Cousins, has been an absolute favourite and we love the fact that most of the children can now say it alongside us during storytime! The weather has unfortunately turned on us this past week, but between showers we have been outside digging, building, being helpful and learning to respect our environment. Thank you Field Mice for a fabulous school year - enjoy the summer, we all need the rest!

**Hedgehog Class** have demonstrated the Character virtues of determination, friendliness and motivation which link with the Academic, Community and Character cornerstones. The children have been loving our sea themed challenges in class and have been motivated to complete them all each week. They have made their own treasure maps, painted pictures of sea turtles, practised their number bonds to 10 and many other activities. In literacy, they have been thinking and writing about who might have swallowed Stanley and in maths they have been sharing and grouping objects. The children loved joining in with sports day and were so encouraging towards each other, cheering their teammates on.



**Squirrel Class** showed great resilience and compassion throughout Sports day, I was impressed with the support they showed each other and how they embraced all the activities on the day. In Literacy we have been focussing on one of Miss Johnstone's favourite books, Stanley's Stick by John Hegley. We have enjoyed learning the story and retelling it in our own words. We have also enjoyed reviewing the vocabulary used and discussing various writing skills John Hegley uses, such as the play on words 'twiggy-back' to show how the stick is carried on the tide. In Woodland school we enjoyed our own stick activity like Stanley. We studied the similarities and difference in British birds' nests and then collected natural materials to create our own nests in the Woodland School area.

**Fox Class** have demonstrated the Cornerstone of community. Linking with our Geography topic, they all wrote postcards to children and staff, explaining a different country in the Amazon Rainforest. They wrote such great postcards that they all received a reply! Our focus character virtue is friendliness and Fox class are being great role-models in welcoming adults into our class and being friendly on the playground. We have discussed how important it is to maintain being friendly even when we are tired. Well done to Fox class for always trying hard to reflect upon their thoughts and actions

**Stag Class** enjoyed taking part and helping to organise sports day. We have also been practising our singing, acting and prop making in preparation for the Key Stage 2 performance 'The Greatest Showman'.









