Here are the learning, activities and events that have been happening in school over the past fortnight.

Our Character Education Focus Virtues this half term

Citizenship Respect

C360 Cornerstones Curriculum

Academic Community Character Innovation

These are the four cornerstones of our curriculum. Each week the children practise virtues that underpin these cornerstones.

Fieldmice Class. We are enjoying being back and exploring our learning with Hedgehog Class. Field Mice have had a fantastic time investigating different bugs and their environments up in Wensley Wood - wellies and coats have been needed!!

Our learning at the moment is focusing on "All About Me" and it has been very interesting to find out about how our bodies work and what the different bones are called.

Hedgehog Class have had a fantastic start to the new year and settled in so quickly! In our topic Me, Myself and I, we have been learning about ourselves, including body part names, how to keep healthy and emotions. In phonics we have already learned 10 sounds and are beginning to blend sounds into words. We also enjoyed a visit by Mrs. Pestaille who taught us how to keep our teeth healthy.

Squirrel Class have worked so hard over the last couple of weeks showing the character virtues of curiosity and motivation. In Literacy we have been learning the story Beegu and writing with adjectives to describe Beegu's appearance and how she is feeling when she is lost. In maths we were very excited to receive some new equipment to help us with our learning – ask your child what they can tell you about using a Rekenrek!

Fox Class have demonstrated the Character virtues of confidence and curiosity. This has been seen in abundance, when we went to London to tour the Houses of Parliament and the Natural History Museum. The children asked great questions to develop their knowledge of British values, including democracy and the Rule of Law. It was an absolute pleasure to take them.

Fox class have settled in well to the start of the new term and I am very excited for the year ahead.

Stag Class have demonstrated the Character virtues of curiosity and critical thinking in their Science work, investigating how we see objects and how light travels. They have made periscopes to explore reflection and created optical illusions to demonstrate refraction. On the KS2 trip to London, they were extremely engaged throughout our tour of the Houses of Parliament and the Natural History Museum, and I was very proud of their enthusiasm for learning and their exemplary behaviour throughout.

- Income support
