Our Character Education Focus Virtues this half term

Citizenship Respect

C360 Cornerstones Curriculum

Academic Community Character Innovation

These are the four cornerstones of our curriculum. Each week the children practise virtues that underpin these cornerstones.

Fieldmice Class have discovered cinnamon scented play-doh, collected, sorted and explored different coloured leaves and thoroughly enjoyed our PE sessions.

We collected leaves in our school grounds and then have used the leaves to help us count, to make pictures with and to make our hats for the harvest service where we worked together with Hedgehog class to recite a poem called The Nut Tree.

Hedgehog Class Hedgehog class were inspiring speakers this week when they all took part in reciting the poem 'Nut Tree' in church as part of our whole school Harvest Festival celebrations. Continuing our autumn and harvest theme we showed resourcefulness using the apples from the local area to make our own apple crumble which we enjoyed taking home and sharing with our families. In maths we have been comparing more and fewer and using a range of objects and manipulatives to demonstrate our understanding.

Squirrel Class demonstrated respect and curiosity this week, when we had a visit from Emily from The Dog's Trust. We enjoyed learning how to stay safe around dogs and made poster to show what we had learned. In Science we demonstrated critical thinking as we conducted our first experiment to test the absorbency of materials. In Maths we have been recording our learning using base tens and tallying to deepen our understanding of place value. We have also made huge progress in our reading and writing and are taking home our Read, Write, Inc books and book bag books for the first time. Well done everyone.



Fox Class have demonstrated the Character virtues of respect and curiosity. My dog, Phoebe, has been in class, as she is a registered Pets As Therapy dog. Fox class have shown great respect, with understanding how to treat a dog, and they have all had a lovely chat with Phoebe about many things in their lives. In Science, Fox class have shown curiosity, as they have been learning about plants. We all completed a great hunt in the school grounds for different seeds and discussed how they had been dispersed. I hope that all of Fox class have a fantastic half term and thank you so much for your hard work and perseverance.

Stag Class have demonstrated the Character virtues of citizenship and confidence in participating in the wonderful Dogs Trust workshop this week. Through role play and discussion, we learned how to behave around dogs in a way that makes the dogs feel comfortable and keeps us safe. We have also shown immense **creativity** in our stunning observational watercolour paintings of apples – the apple harvest was kindly donated by Max's family, and we have enjoyed eating them as well!




