Our Character Education Focus Virtues this half term

Academic Community Character Innovation

These are the four cornerstones of our curriculum. Each week the children practise virtues that underpin these cornerstones.

Fieldmice Class. We have had an incredibly busy two weeks. A second week of Divali celebrations where the children made traditional coconut Laddu snacks, decorated their divas and we even tried to learn a traditional dance! This week we have learnt about the Patron Saint of Scotland, St Andrew. We have been learning about tartan and weaving our own tartan designs.

Everyone enjoyed taking part in the reindeer run/jog/walk this morning and even our youngest children gave it a good go!!

Hedgehog Class: We have been busy getting ready for the Christmas fair, making lots of original craft items to sell. We have also been continuing our Celebrations topic, finishing Diwali and then looking at St. Andrew's Day.

In Maths we have been composing and de-composing numbers to 5 and in science, continuing to look at the Seasons.

Squirrel Class demonstrated creativity and resilience this week in DT where we all learnt a new skill, sewing. We practiced running stitch and cross stitch and when we finished our borders we even had some blanket stitches. In maths we have spent time really embedding place value this term and are now progressing onto addition and subtraction. We have worked hard on writing



numerals correctly as lots of us are reversing numbers so please continue to support your child with numeral writing at home so we get into good habits. Thank you again everyone for ensuring their child has their reading book in school with them every day. We are seeing fantastic progress in both reading and writing, well done.

Fox Class have demonstrated the Character virtues of problem solving and creativity. This week, we have been very lucky to have Mrs Pagett in class, who taught the class how to make beautiful Christmas decorations. The children have made 3 incredible decorations to sell at the Christmas Fair and they are so proud of their work.

Fox class have also been learning about Living things and their habitats in Science. I am so impressed with questions asked and their developing understanding of adaptation and how humans impact the earth. They are great scientists!

If you can answer yes to any of the above you may qualify for free school meals/Pupil Premium

The school office will help with your application. If your application is successful not only will your child receive free school meals, but our school will receive £1,300 additional funding (per child). This is called Pupil Premium.

All applications are confidential.
