C360 Cornerstones Curriculum

Academic Community Character Innovation

These are the four cornerstones of our curriculum. Each week the children practise virtues that underpin these cornerstones.

Fieldmice Class. Our topic this term is colours. The children have enjoyed exploring different colours with jelly baff and have also been using food colouring in water, pouring them into different cups to see what colours they can make. Our book this week is 'Little Red Riding Hood'. The children have enjoyed retelling the story with our dolls house.

Hedgehog Class: We have had a really busy start to the new term with our new topic of Rainbows. We have been using the character virtue of Curiosity with colour-mixing in a variety of ways (often very messy!) and we have also made beautiful rainbow windsocks. In English we have been following the story of Little Red Riding Hood and developing our reading by moving on to Red level books.

Squirrel Class demonstrated the character virtues of creativity this week in literacy as we have been writing calligrams and shape poems. We thought carefully about choosing the appropriate verbs and adjectives to write and perform animal poems. In maths we have moved onto addition now that we are confident with place value. The children used lots of different resources to add two groups together and develop their reasoning using stem sentences. In History we have been working like historians to describe what we can see and ask questions about primary sources related to the Great Fire of London.



Fox Class have demonstrated the Character virtues of determination and resilience. Over the last two weeks, Fox class have come back to school from their Christmas break determined to improve their understanding. In Computing, they are learning how to use the software Scratch, and have supported one another with programming their Sprites.

Everyone in Fox class has been very resilient with asking questions to develop their learning about all of our new topics. I am so impressed with how all of the children have such a great enthusiasm and determination for learning.

Thank you to all parents and carers who have brought in rocks, shells, fossils and crystals to support our new Science topic. We are very lucky to be so supported by you all.

Stag Class demonstrated the virtue of **confidence** when participating in the Rotary Club Youth Speaks competition this week. Nine children took part, and we were blown away by their maturity and ability to speak confidently on a topic in front of an audience. I am so proud of all the children. Special mention must go to Jesse Bull, who received the certificate for best Speaker on the day, and to Tabitha, Eben and Orla, whose presentation on the Wood Wide Web won first place and means they will go on to compete in the next heat. Huge thanks to Mrs Davey who worked so hard with the children to prepare them. We've also been really excited to start learning to play the ukulele in class this week – a new skill for Mrs Chant as well as most of the children, so we are all learning together! It has been great fun and the children have already made brilliant progress.

Do you receive any of the following?

- Income support
- Employment Support Allowance (Income Related)
- Income based Job Seekers Allowance
- Guaranteed Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit and your income (as calculated by the Inland Revenue) is less than £16,190
- Universal Credit
