Lunchtime clubs ensured that those children who go home by bus were still able to take part in clubs. PE Lead was able to deliver CPD and monitor delivery of PE as well as searching out external competitions for children to attend. Children took part in almost all the competitions and tournaments on offer at the local secondary school which introduced them to a larger cohort as well as the transition into secondary school. These tournaments are led by yr 9 and 10 children who are role models for our own pupils. Visiting Taunton Cricket Ground where we saw an international ladies match taking place gave girls in particular a boost in their interest in sports. Pupils were positive in their feedback. Our Forest School provision during the day was initially for intervention but became so successful that larger groups were able to take part. An after school club had a good take up rate. Our Exmoor Challenge groups all completed the walk and thoroughly enjoyed the experience of being physically challenged. This is a right of passage for yr 5/6 children. 		Training did occur but due to some of the older children experiencing some particularly challenging behavior, this was not as successful as we would have wished. We will revisit this next year. Coaches did deliver CPD but due to long term staff sickness, it was difficult to ensure consistency. Our swimming teacher was off for half a term so plans for swimming teaching cpd had to be put on hold. Some problems with the heating of the pool meant that we were not able to use it for all the sessions we would have liked.
