We want to foster this love of reading which can take them to places beyond their own imagination in such a magical way as well as providing them with a knowledge and understanding of the world around them that they may not yet have experienced. It can also support their own writing through the rich and varied vocabulary and sentence structures that they automatically adopt when reading a wide and varied range of books.

Our Learning

Fieldmice and Hedgehog Class -We have been ramping up our rehearsals for the Nativity play in recent weeks with full costume. The children are ready and excited to perform! We have been learning about Diwali, and have made tea light holders as part of our Christmas crafts activities. Construction city has been busy with children building different parts of Bampton out of a range of materials. In maths we have been learning about composition, which is how different numbers are made out of different parts to create a whole.

Squirrel Class had a very exciting visit from Tiverton Museum this week. We learnt how being at school in Victorian times was different to Bampton School today. Boys and girls were separated and we practised reciting arithmetic from the black board. We then used chalk and blackboard pencils to write our names on our own little blackboards, they were very squeaky and we couldn't fit much writing on them. Then we handled Victorian artefacts and tried to work out what they were for. In literacy we finished writing our robin shape poems and in maths we have counting in 10s.

Fox Class have been learning about internet safety. Fox class were visited by Councillor Steve Lodge last Thursday and they were very keen to show all that they had learnt from their Barney and Echo books. This week we have started to think about how a movement or gesture can tell a larger story. They have been busy learning about charcoal and how artists like Laura McKendry use charcoal to convey emotions. In maths we are continuing to work on our column addition and subtraction.

Stag Class have been busy using our new video editing skills to make some fantastic videos that build upon our work on the industrial revolution. I am incredibly impressed by how professional they have turned out and am very proud of the effort that went into making them. We are now starting a new topic on typography and putting our creative and artistic abilities to the test by seeing how we can embed extra meaning into words by considering design aspects such as colour, shape and different typefaces.

Lauryn's work has really impressed us this half term. We have noticed how carefully she is working in literacy ensuring that her sentences and tenses are grammatically correct before writing. Her book is neat and shows pride in her presentation as she thinks carefully before writing. We are also always so impressed with how much English Lauryn has learnt since joining us at Bampton School. Lauryn asks if she is unsure of new words and uses word banks carefully to help build her vocabulary and improve her spelling.

Gully has really impressed Ms Brainch & I with the amount of effort he has been putting into all of his work this week. Gully can sometimes be reluctant to get started independently but this week he has worked well without prompts and been showing how fab he can be.

Maria puts her full effort into everything she does both academically and in the wider school community.
